Each year, the Grant Wood Art Colony hosts one fellow in interdisciplinary performance. The fellowship rotates between dance, theater, and music. This year's Fellow in Interdisciplinary Performance, Christopher Jette, is a composer and new media artist. Jette's Collaborative Performance class (taught in coordination with the Department of Dance, Department of Theatre Arts, School of Music, and School of Art and Art History) held their semester-culminating event, *INTERRUPTED: A Collaborative Performance*, in early December. All three shows were sold out!

During his year, Jette is also directing the [Laptop Orchestra at University of Iowa \(LOUi\)](#). On December 12th, LOUi performed five works that approached the ensemble in different ways.
